John 1:35-51

Jesus Himself Unites Us

Main idea: True unity comes because Jesus calls us to Himself.

There's an old urban legend, about two towns that spent months arguing over where to build a bridge.

- They both wanted a bridge to connect their towns, so that they could come and go.
 - But they couldn't compromise on where to put it.
 - Eventually, they built two bridges right next to each other so no one had to compromise.
- We humans can turn even unity projects into division projects.¹

We live in a world marked by division.²

- We divide over things like race, wealth, politics, and even preferences.³
- But the church, on the other hand, is to be different.
 - We're united not by what we have in common, but by the One who called us.⁴
 - Unity begins not with our sameness, but with His call.⁵

Read John 1:35-51

I get a lot of spam calls. It's crazy.

- It's so bad that most of the time, if I don't recognize the number, I don't even answer anymore. [photo]
 - o But if I get a call from Abby, it pops up on my phone as My Sweetie, and I take the call. [photo]
 - She's the most important person in the world to me!
- That's how we're to treat Jesus when He calls us.

Jesus calls and invites us to follow Him. (v. 35-39)

- In a survey from 2023, the Pew Research Center US adults about religion and spirituality. [graph]
- These two men were already searching. They were following John the Baptist, seeking truth.
 - o When He said, "Come and see," their search found its answer.
 - That same invitation unites every believer. We've all responded to Jesus' call.⁶
- Unity begins when we stop following others and start following Jesus together.

As we do that, Jesus changes who we are. (v. 40-42)

- "Amazing Grace" is the most popular hymn to ever be written.
 - But did you know that John Newton, the author of the hymn, was once a slave trader?
 - After becoming a Christian, he eventually adamantly opposed slavery, and his story shows that no one is too far gone for transformation.
- When Andrew brought his brother Simon to Jesus, Jesus immediately gave him a new name.
 - When Jesus calls us, He doesn't just invite us; He transforms us.⁸
 - o In Jesus, we all receive a new identity: beloved, forgiven, and made new.9

Our unity is built not on our old labels, but on who we've become and are becoming in Christ. 10

Because Jesus calls all kinds of people to Himself. (v. 43-46)

- As Jesus called Philip and Nathanael, His group of followers grew more diverse.
 - There were fishermen, truth-seekers, and even skeptics.
 - o Jesus calls all kinds of people to follow Him, and that's at least one of the things that makes His church beautiful. [Revelation 7:9]
- Unity doesn't erase our differences; it makes something truly awesome out of them. [Romans 12:4-5]
 - Think about it like a potluck dinner: everyone brings something different, but together it makes one great meal. [photo]
 - That's how God calls us to be.
- And if Jesus welcomes all kinds of people, so must we. 11

As we do that, together we'll see how Jesus reveals His glory. (v. 47-51)

- Nathanael began as a skeptic, but ended in worship, declaring, "You are the Son of God!"
- Jesus promised they would see even greater things.
 - When astronauts see Earth from space, they often say it changes how they view everything. [photo]
 - It's so common that there's even a name for it: "Overview Effect." [quote] [quote] [quote]
- As we keep following Jesus together, our unity grows deeper, centered not on ourselves, but on the glory of Christ. 12

So the invitation to know Jesus isn't just an invitation to be personally saved, but to be a witness of His glory coming down from heaven.¹³

- The first disciples came from different towns and backgrounds, yet they became one because they all heard the same words: "Come and see."
- That invitation still unites every believer today.
- No matter who you are or where you've come from, Jesus' call is the same: Come and see.
- Being a church is all about saying yes to Jesus, and walking with others who have said yes, too.
